### MEMBERS' NEWS

It is with sadness that we report the death of **David Bryant** at the end of February from a heart attack. He had been a loyal member of the society for many years, though at the time of his death he was no longer a member.

**Earl Toops** emailed the Secretary from the USA early in January as follows;

(i). He had published in the October 2018 issue of "The Philatelic Exhibitor" magazine (journal of the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors) an article entitled "A Tale of Two Exhibits and Three Countries" which was the "creation" narrative of his Trucial States study-acquisition, research, false starts and turning a collection into an exhibit.

(ii). His article "Trucial States Palm Trees and Dhow Issue of 1961" was the feature article in the December 2018 issue of "The American Philatelist" (journal of the American Philatelic Society). This article was a historical, cultural, social and philatelic "deep background" of this Trucial States issue.

(iii). His one-frame exhibit on Trucial States won a Gold medal at CHICAGOPEX held on 16-18 November 2018.

Following on from the above **Earl Toops** has emailed within the past week to say that his Trucial States exhibit won a Large Gold and the Grand Award for best 1-frame exhibit at the Plymouth (MI) show over the weekend of 13-14 April in the USA. This means that he must now participate in the Champion of Champions 1-frame competition to be held in St Louis, MO in 2020. His Trucial States exhibit got its first public showing at the CPS, so, in a sense, all the above awards stemmed from his visits to the Cambridge Philatelic Society



At the RPSL Regional Meeting at Tempsford on 23rd March 2019 **John George** displayed two frames of Indian States. At the same event **Lillian Swift** displayed Danish Railways, **Richard Husband** GB Perfins sent abroad and **Adrian Boggust** caves and caving.

**Graham Wylde** displayed GB Miscellanea at Fenland Stamp Club on 28th March 2019.

At the Society Auction held in March this year **David Leonard** placed different sections of his collection for sale and kindly donated 50% of monies raised from these auction lots to the Society. The Society is very grateful to David for this very kind gesture which contributed to the success of the auction.

### Friday 18th January

#### EASTER ISLAND AND STRIKE POSTS OF CAMBRIDGE

The new year opened with two of our past presidents displaying material; **Rufus Barnes** on Easter Island and **Simon Kelly** on Strike Posts of Cambridge.

Simon kicked the evening off with information covering the background to the strike which was from 26th January 1971 through to 7th March 1971. This included a copy of the Royal Mail authority enabling **Donald Hofford** to provide the service. Many examples of the 2/- stamp for local deliveries were displayed plus the 4/- stamp which was for Cambridge environs. A special cover to France covering all issued stamps was posted to France on the last day of the strike.

Rufus presented a mixture of material arising from the early days of the post to more modern use. Many postcards were shown, different first flight covers, new stamps issued in 1940 by Chilean Post office and many special covers, both from and into Easter Island. Various sheet and booklet stamps were shown, including overprints, one of which was "EI" for a special expedition.

### Wednesday 6th February

#### PERSIA AND ASPECTS OF IRAN

**Nigel Gooch** entertained us with a large variety of material from Persia in the first half, followed by Iran in the second half, the latter including many colourful stamps. The display included not only basic stamps but many varieties, posted covers and pictorial postcards on the two countries, including for Persia pre-stamp mail from 1836.



### Friday 15th February

#### COMPETITION EVENING

(35 YEAR, TRANSPORTATION OF MAIL, THEMATICS, FOREIGN, COMMONWEALTH AND 16 SHEET)

We gave a warm welcome to **John Spencer** and **Richard Page** from Leighton Buzzard Philatelic Society who were extremely helpful and professional in the way in which they carried out the judging, and commenting afterwards on the various entries.

### Friday 15th March

#### VISIT FROM HUNTINGDONSHIRE PHILATELIC SOCIETY

We welcomed **John Sims** and **Bill Gibb** from Huntingdonshire P.S to display. John covered what he considered were the four most important pioneer Australian aviators involved with the development of commercial aviation with an impressive display of flown covers. Bill covered farthing stamps which commenced in 1896 with Barbados and their different issues over several years, followed by nine other British colonies, mainly Caribbean islands, but also Malta.

### Wednesday 3rd April

#### SPECIMEN STAMPS OF QUEEN VICTORIA 1840-1902

We gave a warm welcome to **David Leathart**. David gave a power point talk on GB Queen Victoria sample and specimen stamps for the period 1840 to 1902, which also included colour trials, government officials and telegraph stamps. In the second half he covered many special issues which encompassed revenue stamps, unappropriated stamps and various court fees. Each half involved a wonderful display of the different types of specimen, cancelled and other overprints, which were available, including several stamps which are difficult to find.
